## How to Produce a Downloadable and Photocopy Ready Copy of the EdWeek Op-Ed for your Voter Registration/Turn Out the Vote Drive project

We encourage you to closely consider the value of handing out and reading copies of the op-ed with your students for the following reasons:

- 1) It is a great way to introduce the project.
- 2) It helps rationalize and legitimize the project for students
- 3) It offers an opportunity to develop critical thinking and reading skills
- 4) It shows students the powerful impact that writing and Call to Action journalism can have

## Here is how you do it:

There is an option at the top of all EdWeek articles to print out a PDF of the op-ed, as there is on all EdWeek articles and Opinion pieces.

Simply find and click on the icon of a printer near the top of the online EdWeek op-ed that brought you here. Once you have printed out the op-ed, you can then mass produce copies of it to read in class with your students (or as homework) to introduce project to them.

Lastly, please note that EdWeek's website operates on a metered model that allows non-subscribers a limited number of free articles per month, so anyone coming to edweek.org for the first time will be able to read/save/print the essay for personal use without hitting a paywall. Depending on how often you visit EdWeek, this downloadable and photocopy ready option should work for you or one of your colleagues.
